



## ASI Cookbook Recipe of the Month!

#### Snickerdoodle Cobbler

#### Ingredients:

- 1/3 cup unsalted butter.
- 3/4 cup whole milk.
- 2 TSP vanilla extract.
- 1/1/2 cups sugar.
- 1 1/2 cups flower.
- 2 1/4 TSP baking powder.
- 3/4 TSP salt.
- 2 TSP cinnamon,
- 1 1/2 cups brown sugar.
- 1 1/2 cups hot water.

#### Topping:

1/4 cup sugar 1/2 TSP cinnamon.



#### **Directions:**

- 1.) Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Spread melted butter in 9X13 baking pan.
- 2.) Whisk milk, vanilla, and sugar in a large bowl.
- 3.) Add flour, baking powder, salt, and cinnamon. Whisk until just combined.
- 4.) Spoon batter over butter (be careful not to mix). Sprinkle brown sugar over batter.
- 5.) Gently pour hot water over the batter and sugar.
- 6.) Bake for 30-35 minutes until golden brown and mostly set.
- 7.) Mix topping sugar and cinnamon, sprinkle over hot cobbler.
- 8.) Let cool slightly before serving!
