Celebrate CB Parade



Down Syndrome

You'll explore the medical facts behind the diagnosis while gaining insight into the social and cultural realities faced by individuals and their families. You'll look beyond the label to discover the depth of potential and possibility in every person with Down Syndrome. More importantly, this class is not about sympathy—it's about empowerment and inclusion.

ASI Cookbook Recipe of the Month! Pizza Tot Casserole

Ingredients:

- -1 pound ground beef.
- -1 small onion, diced.
- -2 cups marinara sauce.
- 1 TSP Italian seasoning.
- -Salt and Pepper (to taste)
- -2 cups shredded mozzarella cheese.
- -1 bag (32 oz) frozen tater toys

Optional toppings: pepperoni, olives, bell pepper green onions, mushrooms.



Directions:

- 1.) Preheat oven to 400 degrees.
- 2.) In a large skillet, cook the ground beef and the diced onion until the beef is browned and the onion is soft. Once the ground beef is cooked, drain any grease.
- 3.) Add the marinara sauce, Italian seasoning, a pinch of salt and pepper to the ground beef and onion mixture. Stir to combine and let simmer.
- 4.) In a baking dish place sauce ground beef mixture, with a layer of mozzarella cheese, and a single layer of tater tots. Continue to alternate layers until gone.
- 5.) Place the baking dish into the oven and bake for 25-30 minutes. Or until the tater tots are golden and crispy, and the cheese melted and bubbly.
- 6.) Once cooked, remove from the oven let cool before serving.
